International students must submit all documents that are required for admissions to Arlington Baptist University.

They are:

- Application
- \$25 Application Fee
- Personal Questionnaire Essay
- Recommendation Form
- Official High or Secondary Transcript (must be translated into English language)
- Official College Transcripts (must be translated into US Academic equivalency)
- Medical Physical
- Meningitis shot
- TB Test
- Affidavit of Support – **International students are required to deposit \$5000 (U.S. dollars) toward their school expenses. The \$5000 deposit will be refunded if student has not attended any classes. If student attends at least 1 day of class, the \$5000 is non-refundable.**
- Passport
- Copy of I-94
- Permanent Residence Card (if applicable)

After all the above have been satisfied, the student will be sent a completed copy of their I-20 along with an acceptance letter from Arlington Baptist University. The student should then apply for a student visa (F-1) through the United States Embassy or consulate. It is strongly suggested that foreign students make application for student visas to persons residing in the United States. Once proof of F-1 status has been sent to Arlington Baptist University, student will be allowed to enroll for classes.

The immigration authorities must be notified if the student:

- **Does not report on the expected date,**
- **Does not register for 12 hours,**
- **Does not maintain regular attendance in classes,**
- **Fails to maintain at least a "C" average,**
- **Drops all course, or**
- **Does not stay current with his/her school finances.**
