OUESTIONS?

- **Q:** How long do I have to complete a Distance Education course?
- A: Courses are intended to be completed in 120 days from the time the materials are received. If necessary, you may request a 30-day extension.
- Q: Can I earn a Bachelor's degree through distance studies
- A: Only Bible courses are planned at this time.
- Q: Are these the same courses that are offered on campus at Arlington Baptist College?
- A: Distance Education courses are based on material similar to that presented at Arlington Baptist College but are tailored to fit the situation of the Distance Education student.
- **O:** How will my work be graded?
- A: An instructor at Arlington Baptist College will personally review the work you send in and evaluate it based on the criteria given in the course syllabus. You will receive written comments and grades through the mail.
- **O:** What about testing?
- A: When you have completed a designated portion of the course, you will send in a form requesting an exam. The test will be mailed to you in a sealed envelope and should be taken with a proctor present if you plan to apply for college credit for the course. (Many Junior Colleges offer this kind of test proctoring service for a minimal fee.) The proctor will sign a verification form and mail the test to your instructor. Your instructor will grade your test and return it to you.
- **Q:** What will I receive in the way of course materials?
- A: Your course packet will consist of some general information and instructions which apply specifically to your course. All forms you will need to communicate with your instructor, submit assignments, request tests, etc. The course syllabus giving goals and objectives, instructions and assignments will come with a study guide or a textbook to be used along with your Bible.
- Q: What if, after I receive the materials, I find they are not what I was looking for?
- A: You have 21 days in which to return the materials unmarked for a full tuition refund. (The \$50 registration fee is not refundable.)
- **Q:** If I take it for institute credit can I upgrade it at a later date?
- A: Yes, but it will be more costly in the long run and it will not be possible to later issue a letter grade which could make it non transferable.

WHY OFF-CAMPUS STUDIES?

Our *Distance Education Program* makes it possible for you to study in your home, working around your own schedule. The study materials being produced are designed to help you successfully master the material.

COLLEGE CREDIT

Courses are available on an institute or credit basis. Each course may be taken for two credit hours, in which case a letter grade will be issued and credits may be applied towards a degree.

THE INSTITUTE PROGRAM

Students who are not interested in college credit may enroll at the institute level on a pass/fail basis. A Bible certificate will be given for each 5 courses completed. With the completion of 15 courses, a non accredited Bible diploma will be issued during our May Commencement exercises.

COST

Cost at the Institute level is \$350 per course plus a \$50 non-refundable registration fee for each order of one or more courses. Cost for those receiving college credit is \$450 per course plus a \$50 non-refundable fee for each order of one or more courses. (All fees are subject to change without notice)

SPECIAL ENROLLMENT FOR MARRIED COUPLES

A married couple who agrees to share a single set of course materials may *concurrently* enroll in the *same distance education course for one and a half times* the normal distance education charges for *college credit*. All enrollment requirements must be met by both parties and each will be responsible for their own work. A single registration fee will apply provided both students enroll at the same level, be it institute or college credit. Otherwise, two registration fees will be assessed. If only one member chooses to withdraw during the examination period the registration fee will be deducted from the partial refund.

ENROLLMENT LIMITATIONS

Because of the self-discipline needed, students enrolling in our distance education courses for the first time will be limited to two courses unless specifically approved through both the registrar and Distance Education director. Repeating students will be limited to three courses. Our goal is not to hinder but to ensure your success.

REFUND POLICY

If for any reason you find a course is not satisfactory, simply return the materials unmarked within 21 days from receipt for a full refund excluding the registration fee which is not refundable.

COURSES AVAILABLE

It is suggested that courses be taken in listed order.

NEW TESTAMENT SURVEY

(*DBI-1202-3*) - Each book of the New Testament is studied with regard to its chief events, characters and teachings. The significance of the historical, cultural and political background is considered.

OLD TESTAMENT SURVEY

(*DBI-1201-3*) - An overview of each Old Testament book is given. The Historical, geographical and cultural backgrounds are explored, as well as the purpose of each Old Testament book.

• BIBLE STUDY METHODS

(*DBI-1205-3*) - An introduction to the various tools of Bible study, the methodical and inductive approach to the study of Scripture and the principles of interpretation

• EVANGELISM

(*DCM-1210-3*) - Evangelism is defined and methods of evangelism are examined from their scriptural and historical foundations. Principles are sought which will make the students more effective in their witnessing. This course requires pastoral approval. (See other side)

• PENTATEUCH - GENESIS

(*DBI-2203-3*) - A chapter by chapter study of Genesis emphasizes the foundations of civilization, religion and the nation of Israel. The beginnings of God's plan of redemption receives attention.

• BIBLE DOCTRINE

(DTH-2201-3) - An introduction to Bible doctrine is offered, emphasizing definition of terms and the ten major doctrines of the Bible.

• ECCLESIOLOGY

(DTH-2210-3) - The student is involved in a detailed study of the church including: its nature and function; its officers, its ordinances, and its place in God's plan. Various views of the nature of the church are given and the local church view is supported. The means of carrying out the church's mission are surveyed. Articles 13 and 14 of the Statement of Faith are explained.

• ACTS: LIFE OF PAUL

(DBI-3201-3)- An analysis of the acts of the apostles as revealed in the book of Acts., this course considers background information regarding the historical setting, cultural setting and missionary activities of the early church. The ministry of Paul receives special attention.

• ROMANS-FOUNDATIONS OF THE FAITH

(DBI-3202A-3) - An in-depth study of the book of Romans with a focus on Paul's logical five-step progression in his presentation of the foundational truths of the Christian faith.

• CULTS & WORLD VIEWS

(DCM-3201) - An examination of the teachings of major pseudo-Christian cults is given against the backdrop of a Christian world view. Several other significant world views are also examined in an attempt to better prepare the student for witnessing and defending their faith in an increasingly secular society. In examining the cults, emphasis is placed on the history, development, and erroneous teachings of these belief systems as well as the unexamined presuppositions which underlie these systems.

THEOLOGY I

(DTH-3205-3) - Based on the definitions studies in Bible Doctrine, the relationship of doctrines to each other is treated here. The course begins by considering how man comes to know God and continues to explore the revelation of God to man through Scripture, the works of God, man and his sin, salvation, and the end things. Study is made to show how one doctrine gives rise to another. Prerequisite: DTH 2201-3.

• THEOLOGY II

(DTH-3206-3) - Continues Theology I. Prerequisite DTH 2201-3

• HERMENEUTICS

(DBI-3201) - This course is an introduction to the general and special principles of Biblical interpretation. The importance, history, and methods of interpretation will be investigated. Prerequisite: Junior rank. Recommended: Theology I & II.

• BIBLE ELECTIVE

SENIOR THESIS

(DBI-4699) - The student will write a paper of at least 25 - 30 pages on an agreed upon topic. An outline, endnotes or footnotes, and Bibliography will be included. At least ten different sources should be referenced within the work. The BS in Bible by Extension will not be granted without completion of this course. The student will be allowed 6 months in which to complete this course. Cost is \$1140 plus registration. Prerequisite: Completion of all other course work.
