Miller holds a Texas Teacher Certificate in Secondary English (grades 6-12) and is lifetime certified.

She has been a professor at Arlington Baptist University since 2012 and serves as Field Supervisor to English Language Arts 7-12 teacher candidates.

She lives in Arlington, Texas, and is a member of Cross City Church (Euless, Texas).

Arlington Baptist University is a private Bible university in Arlington, Texas, offering Bachelor and Masters degrees.
